Website Development Agreement

Between us, Campus On Fire, and you, <your name>

Summary:

In short

Us: We have the experience and ability to do everything we've agreed with you and we'll do it all in a professional and timely manner. We'll endeavor to meet every deadline that's set and on top of that we'll maintain the confidentiality of everything you give us.

Termination

You are free to terminate this agreement anytime for any reason.

Deadline

We will try our best to complete initial development within 2 months from mutually agreed start date. Please be understanding if there are any unlikely events or force majeure that we may finish our work few weeks after previously agreed deadline.

Website

We will do complete ground up web application development including architecture, infrastructure setup for both staging and production environments, acceptance testing and mobile apps for iOS and Android.

Browser testing

Browser testing no longer means attempting to make a website look the same in browsers of different capabilities or on devices with different size screens. It does mean ensuring that a person's experience should be appropriate to the capabilities of a browser or device.

Mobile browser testing

Testing using popular smaller screen devices is essential in ensuring that a person's experience appropriate to the capabilities of the device they're using. We will test the app in:

iOS 9: Safari, Google Chrome Android: Google Chrome

We won't test with Blackberry, Opera Mini/Mobile, specific Android devices, Windows or other mobile browsers.
